

TAFELMUSIK'S ARTIST TRAINING, EDUCATION AND AUDIENCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES IN 2010-2011

Tafelmusik's vision is to be an international centre of musical excellence for many generations to come, and several of our music education programmes are designed to develop future artists and audiences. In the 2010-2011 season, Tafelmusik's education and community development programmes will engage over 6,500 school children, teachers, families, music students and professional musicians through artist and teacher training, and free educational outreach concerts in Canada and abroad.

Artist Training

Tafelmusik Baroque Summer Institute

In June 2011, pre-professional and professional musicians from all over the world gather in Toronto for the tenth annual **Tafelmusik Baroque Summer Institute (TBSI)** – a unique training programme in instrumental and vocal baroque performance. TBSI is an intensive 14-day residency offered at the Faculty of Music at the University of Toronto, and serves to nurture future generations of period performance musicians. Many graduates of TBSI have gone on to professional careers as period-performance specialists. In addition to the Alumni that are currently employed by Tafelmusik, graduates of TBSI are currently performing in several professional music ensembles across North America, including Arion Baroque Orchestra (Montréal), Studio de musique ancienne de Montréal, La Chapelle de Québec, Pacific Baroque (Vancouver), Opera Atelier (Toronto), Apollo's Fire (The Cleveland Baroque Orchestra), Mercury Baroque (Houston), and the Handel & Haydn Society (Boston).

Baroque Orchestra-in-Residence at the University of Toronto

During the 2010-2011 season, Tafelmusik enters its seventh term as the **Baroque Orchestra-in-Residence** at the University of Toronto. This partnership was established to ensure that future generations of musicians will have the opportunity to access period performance training of an international calibre. During its tenure as the Baroque Orchestra-in-Residence, Tafelmusik will collaborate with the University of Toronto on a variety of educational activities throughout the academic year. The Advanced Certificate and Masters in Performance programme is part of this ongoing partnership with the University of Toronto.

The **Master of Music in Performance (Instrumental)** programme will be offered again during the 2010-2011 season. This two-year graduate program is an intensive immersion in baroque performance on period instruments, with private lessons and coaching by Tafelmusik musicians. A programme highlight is a free concert by Masters and ACP students performing alongside members of Tafelmusik.

The Faculty of Music at the University of Toronto and Tafelmusik enter their fifth year of offering the **Advanced Certificate in Performance (Baroque Option)**. The ACP is an intensive one-year, full-time accredited programme that allows graduate-level students baroque performance training on period instruments.

On an annual basis, Tafelmusik performs **free education and outreach concerts** each year at Trinity-St. Paul's Centre for families and school groups from the GTA. A total of four concerts will be offered in March 2011 reaching more than 2,600 people. In recent years, Tafelmusik has focused on creating educational programmes that promote a multidisciplinary approach to studying baroque and classical music. This year Tafelmusik will continue to explore the connection between music and astronomy with *The Galileo Project*, a programme created by Tafelmusik double bassist Alison Mackay. In addition, Tafelmusik provides curriculum-linked educational materials for students and teachers in preparation for these concerts.

Tafelmusik also performs a series of education and outreach concerts for student audiences while on tour. These concerts are supported by Sun Life Financial.

Students attend a Tafelmusik performance and participate in workshops and sectionals leading up to a mass performance alongside members of the Orchestra and Choir.

Partnering with the Analekta label, in 2005 Tafelmusik launched the first album in the new TafelKIDS™ recording series with *Baroque Adventure: The Quest for Arundo Donax*. Winner of a 2006 JUNO Award in the category of "Children's Album of the Year," *Baroque Adventure: The Quest for Arundo Donax* uses the imaginative combination of music and story-telling to introduce children, students, parents and teachers to baroque and classical music.

Continuing upon the success of *Baroque Adventure: The Quest for Arundo Donax*, in the 2008/2009 season Tafelmusik launched a ground-breaking new web-based education game – **TafelKIDS™: A Baroque Adventure WebQuest**. This project is a virtual worldwide web-quest to experience the great music, art, history and grandeur of the baroque era. Young learners will help Bach rewrite his musical scores, dance for the King at Versailles and travel to Venice to help Vivaldi conduct his orchestra. Tafelmusik developed **TafelKIDS™: A Baroque Adventure**

WebQuest with two experts in the gaming field and co-founders of the Canadian Game Studies Association: **Suzanne de Castelle**, Associate Dean of Education at Simon Fraser University, and **Jen Jenson**, who is on faculty at York University.

"As we begin the 21st century, a global library card, museum pass, and music collection are at the fingertips of school students, who are much more equipped to access the cultural riches of the internet than their parents" states **Alison Mackay**, creator of *Baroque Adventure: The Quest for Arundo Donax*. "It is possible now to listen to a work by Jean-Baptiste Lully, the court composer to Louis XIV, while at the same time viewing the original notes from which the musicians played, and, through online access, virtually sitting in the exact room at Versailles for which the music was composed. We hope that our WebQuest will be an exciting way for students to travel in the world that gave birth to European baroque music and to the artistic and musical treasures created in the 17th and 18th centuries around the globe."
